




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Editorial Letter

More than surviving, we are thriving.

When the news of the global pandemic arrived, Tecnológico de Monterrey had to take a stand. We knew that the decision we made in March 2020 would have long-term consequences. I am happy to say that we took the right decision: **to put the health of our community above everything else.**

The Vice Rectory for International Affairs played a leading role in the decision-making process. I can confidently say that my team not only surf the pandemic and all the implications it brought, but they also **thrive in the work from home-era and its new challenges.**

More than surviving, we are thriving.

If I could summarize this year of work in one word, it would be **innovation**. The creativity, adaptation to change, and implementation of new academic experiences has become the flagship of internationalization both in Mexico and in the rest of the world.

This 2020 we put in motion an integrative initiative called Global Learning with three pillars. The first one, *Global Classroom by Tec de Monterrey started in 2018 and has delivered amazing results in terms of academic competencies. The second pillar is called *Global Week: Diversity in a Global World was launched in October 2020.

The third pillar is still under construction and it aims towards achieving the goal of all students to live an international academic experience through the use of technology and in an international collaborative environment. I'm sure that with the help of our international partners and their professors we would achieve our ultimate goal: to give students an international academic experience. We are not stopping due to the pandemic, we are expanding the type of experiences by including hybrid and virtual opportunities and components.

In this report you will find a summary of internationalization in the past ten years, the efforts of 2020, and our ace under the sleeve: virtual international academic experiences.

Pandemic 2020: a different year

2020 was a very different year for every institution. The global pandemic due to COVID19 has changed the way Tecnológico de Monterrey professors teach, the students learn, and how the employees work. The number one priority is to **protect the health of Tec community**.

On March 12th 2020, Tecnológico de Monterrey was one of the first institutions to suspend face-to-face activities. Professors and teachers took a one-week workshop to migrate all activity to a virtual format called HyFlex+Tec.

The International Finance Corporation, organization of the World Bank, **praised Tecnológico de Monterrey action** during the pandemic situation during the webinar: "Shaping the future of transformational education and lessons from COVID-19: Mexico shows the way" in November 18th 2020.

International Experiences in 10 years

The first report of mobility, in 2010, shows that the number of Tecnológico de Monterrey students that lived an academic international experience were **6,705**.

The creation of new programs, the renewal of partnerships, and big efforts done by the offices and departments of the Vice Rectory for International Affairs helped increased the quantity of students that were able to have an international experience.

The report of 2019, a few months before the COVID19 spread became a pandemic, shows that **10,528** students had at least one international experience before graduating.

For 2020, a very challenging year for international activities, hybrid and virtual programs as well as the development of the Global Learning initiative allowed **4,124** students to live an academic international experience.

The Vice Rectory for International Affairs has proved experience in creating successful programs, providing high quality virtual experiences, and continuously innovating.

Just as the health pandemic and the travel restrictions will cease, **we will** continue to offer our students life-changing international academic experiences.


Growth in international mobility of Tecnológico de Monterrey students in the last 10 years*

International Undergraduate Students since 2010

Our students have been able to interact with other cultures without having to leave the country thanks to the presence **of international students** and **faculty from around the world**. This multicultural environment promoted the global outlook of Tecnológico de Monterrey community.

In 2010, Tecnológico de Monterrey received **5,301** international students. The number of students has been steadily increasing, only to have a slight decline in 2020 due to the COVID19 pandemic, where **4,433** foreign students enrolled in an exchange program, virtual courses or full time at Tecnológico de Monterrey.

The 4,433 students that Tecnológico de Monterrey welcomed in 2020: 918 are non-degree seeking international students and **3,515** are degree-seeking international students.

International Undergraduate Students since 2010

The Vice Rectory for International Affairs is redesigning the experiences for foreign students with formats like **Virtual Exchange Programs** where international students can take classes with Tecnológico de Monterrey faculty and students with courses that are available in Spanish or in English.

As well as the opportunity to participate in the Global Learning initiatives like ***Global Classroom by Tec de Monterrey** with semester-long collaborations designed by a Tecnológico de Monterrey professor and a professor from their home institution.

Another opportunity for foreign students to discuss world issues with people from other cultures is possible thanks to ***Global Week: Diversity in a Globalized World** with a one-week collaboration between Tec and their home institution.











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

Global Learning

The objectives of implementing Global Learning at Tecnológico de Monterrey* are:

1. Opportunity to generate internationalization experiences with meaningful learning that links students in a multicultural environment.

2. Exposing the student to real problems in a global context, allowing the development of skills and competencies, promoting diversity, inclusion, and appreciation for other cultures and their own, with special emphasis on the Sustainable Development Goals.

3. Promote collaborative work in a digital environment, making use of technological tools to connect students.

In 2018 we started ***Global Classroom by Tec de Monterrey.** In 2020 we added ***Global Week: Diversity in a Globalized World.** And we are preparing to launch **Global Challenge.**

The Global Learning Initiative will foster the design and inclusion of formats such as COIL and others that will benefit more students, allowing internationalization at home.

Global Classroom by Tec de Monterrey

Global Classroom by Tec de Monterrey* is a strategic initiative of the Vice Rectory for International Affairs consolidated as one of the most innovative programs in 2020 achieved an all-time high.

The health pandemic made Global Classroom by Tec de Monterrey the best choice to have an international academic experience.

The students used technological tools to learn in a multicultural environment. In 2020, **62 courses** were linked with partner universities from where **1,652 undergraduate Tecnológico de Monterrey students** benefited from this initiative as well as **1,732 international students** from **40** partner universities.



Global Week: Diversity in a Globalized World

Tec Week (Semana Tec) is a curricular learning unit of full immersion activities or experiences, inside or outside campus, which aims to contribute primarily to the development of transversal competences.

In 2020, undergraduate students in their third semester (sophomore students) were offered activity weeks focused on the values: Entrepreneurial Spirit, Global Vision, Leadership, and Human Sensitivity.

The Vice Rectory for International Affairs coordinates the Global Week along with the School of Social Sciences and Government during week 6 and week 12 of the Fall Semester (August-December) 2020.



The global health pandemic changed the world. At this point there were two possible responses: to wait until COVID19 gets under control or to reinvent international experiences. The Vice Rectory for International Affairs chose the latter.

The year 2020 was the year of innovation, we took our expertise from the past ten years and implemented new academic experiences in a virtual format. We offered the traditional programs such as internships, research stays, certificates, and workshops virtually.

But we also innovated with propelling the initiative Global Classroom by Tec de Monterrey, Global Week: Diversity in a Global World and offering Virtual Exchange Programs as partial, combined and full academic workload for undergraduate students at Tecnológico de Monterrey and for foreign students from our partner universities.

We are very thankful that many of our partners chose to trust us and continue to work with us in this international academic adventure. This great effort would not be in vain, we are confident that the internationalization of universities is evolving with us, and that mobility and virtual experiences will continue to shape students for many generations to come.
